Organizer: civil society organization, cultural organization

Target Group: all ages groups

Time required for preparation: 2 days

Time required for implementation: 2 hours

Venue/place (inside, outside): inside-arrange a good venue without background noise

Suitable time: anytime, but confirmed with the interviewee

Possibility to implement online: possible online

Short description of the method (max. 100 words):

The Interview is not an ordinary discussion, but one that meets some minimum requirements: the conversation takes place between a journalist and a person who arouses interest among the public (what the interviewee says has informative value); a publication consent must be given to the journalist by the interlocutor; the discussion is recorded and published on a Q&A format. A good interview depends not only on having a good interviewee but also on the interviewer's skills to get the best side from the person being interviewed.

Implementation of the method in the project (max. 100 words):

In the frame of the In-Cult partnership, all project partners including LSFTB conducted 5 interviews with persons that contribute to the preservation of the selected cultural treasures (a museum director, a craftsman, a singer, a writer, etc.). All the interviews were carried out with the support of the senior working groups.

Step by step description of the method (max. 200 words):

- 1. Choosing the right topic and the right interlocutor
- choose the right person for your topic
- choose the right topic for the person you need to interview. Do not prepare a topic that your interlocutor could not talk about.
- 2. Preparation of the interview (documentation, question plan)

Before starting the discussion with the interviewee, we must have a gook knowledge of the topic and the person chosen.

The questions must be easily understood, clear and to the point.

Scheduling the meeting

- Arrange a good venue: background noise is generally not a good idea.
- Confirm the time and the place with the interviewee.
- 3. Discussion (Relationship between journalist and interviewee)

Maintaining the eye contact as much as possible

4. Editing of the final article

Teaching and Learning (max. 100 words):

By reading the interviews, in English or translated into all the languages of the project partners, one will gain in-depth knowledge about cultural treasures selected by the project partners from Germany, Italy, Spain, Romania, Serbia and Bulgaria.

Asking questions is sometimes harder than giving answers. "You need a good knowledge of the field you are referring to, a good knowledge of the person you are addressing, a good mix between personal curiosity and the supposed curiosity of the audience you work for". (Andrei Plesu)
